MINUTE

BOOK

Meeting held Tuesday August 27<sup>th</sup> 1940.

- ① Proposed Mr Hammond seconded Mr Baker that a War Time Allotment Association be formed.
- ② Proposed Mr Baker seconded Mr Broxon that the Association be called "The Eastcote Allotment Association".
- ③ Proposed Mr King seconded Mr Baker that the following rules be adopted.
  - 1) The objects of the Association to be, a) to induce members to crop and maintain their allotments to the best advantage b) to offer at reasonably reduced rates Seeds, lime, etc. to all members, c) to generally protect the interests of members.
  - 2) Membership shall be open to any allotment-holder in Eastcote, who shall pay an annual subscription of not less than 1/- (one shilling), this sum includes members wives, and is payable from October 1<sup>st</sup> for the ensuing year. The committee shall have power to approve or reject a candidate for membership.
  - 3) The affairs of the Association shall be managed by a committee of management (hereinafter called the committee) who shall be empowered to act on behalf of the Association.
  - 4) The ex-officio officers, viz.  
Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary,

Treasurer and Technical Advisor, shall with a Committee of three be elected annually at the Annual General Meeting, from the ordinary members of the Association. At the Annual General Meeting, to be held in January, the whole of such a Committee shall retire, but be eligible for re-election. H)

5) That the Committee have authority to co-opt additional members to the Committee as and when required.

6) The Committee shall meet at a minimum period of monthly intervals.

7) A Special General Meeting of the Association may be called by the Committee at any time, or by a requisition signed by at least ten of the ordinary members sent to the Secretary, who shall within 14 days of receipt call a Special General Meeting at which the business only for which such a meeting is called shall be considered, and the meeting shall be declared void if less than 20 members are present. 5) 6)

8) No alteration or addition shall be made to these rules except with the approval of the Annual General Meeting or at a Special General Meeting convened for such a purpose. Notice of any proposed alteration or 7)

addition shall be given to the Secretary at least 21 days before the date of such a meeting.

4) A temporary Committee acting until the first Annual General Meeting in January 1941 shall be as follows:—
