## “SUMMER SHOW ONLINE” NOW OPEN FOR ENTRIES

**We are replacing our usual Summer Show with an online version. Take a look at our website to see the Spring Show Online exhibits to get inspired. Plan your entries for the Summer Show now!**

### How to take part

- Exhibitors take photos of their exhibits and email them to Sue (Sue.Alexander99@btconnect.com) any time before 5pm on **Wednesday 9 June**.
- Our judge reviews the exhibits anonymously. "Best in Show" awarded for each of the three sections – Flowers, Vegetables and Fruit. No points will be awarded and no points accumulated towards any annual cups.
- Summer Show Gallery on the EHS website will display the exhibits with exhibitor's name and awards during week commencing 14 June.

### Rules

1. Exhibits are photographed either in a vase, or in your garden, unless a vase, dish or plate is stated.
2. All photographs of exhibits are to taken between 1 April 2021 and 9 June 2021.
3. Exhibits which were entered in the Spring Online Show are to be excluded from this Show.
4. Exhibits are not judged on the quality of the photograph. The photograph needs to portray the exhibit clearly. It should display the exhibit close up, as if it was on the show bench. For example, take the image in a good light, use a plain background, avoid the surrounding room or garden.
5. Exhibits must be grown by the exhibitor.
6. Maximum of 3 entries per class from each exhibitor.
7. All entries to be submitted by 5 pm on Wednesday 9 June.
8. Each entry to be clearly annotated with exhibitor's name and class number.
9. Each exhibitor to have current 2020/21 red membership card. Renewals can be arranged by post or by visiting the Trading Hut prior to Show Date, 12 June.

## “SUMMER SHOW ONLINE” SHOW SCHEDULE

### Flowers Section -

- Class 1 - Hanging basket, photographed from below, showing the best side.
- Class 2 - Flowering plants or bulbs growing in a tub, pot or in the garden
- Class 3 - Flowering shrub or tree, photograph the flowers rather than the whole item
- Class 4 - Hosta, 1 plant in the garden or 5 leaves in a vase, could be single or mixed cultivars
- Class 5 - Tulip, 1 bloom
- Class 6 - Any other bulb, 1 bloom
- Class 7 - Delphinium, 1 spike
- Class 8 - Single rose, any variety
- Class 9 - Roses, arranged facing forward in a vase or bowl, at least 7 blooms
- Class 10 - Sweet peas, 7 stems, 1 cultivar
- Class 11 - Sweet peas, arranged facing forward, at least 9 stems
- Class 12 - Summer flowers, 1 vase arranged facing forward
- Class 13 - Grasses, 1 vase arranged facing forward, 2 or more cultivars
- Class 14 - Camellias, 3 blooms, same cultivar, floating in dish of water
- Class 15 - Clematis, 3 blooms, same cultivar, floating in dish of water
- Class 16 - Pansies or violas, 5 blooms floating in dish of water
- Class 17 - African violet, 1 pot
- Class 18 - Fuchsia, 1 pot
- Class 19 - Pelargonium, 1 pot
- Class 20 - Succulent, 1 pot
- Class 21 - Cactus, 1 pot
- Class 22 - Orchid, 1 pot
- Class 23 - Any other flower, 1 stem, not eligible for any other class.

### Vegetables Section -

- Class 24 - Lettuces, 2, on a plain plate
- Class 25 - Rhubarb, 3 sticks, on a plain plate
- Class 26 - Any other vegetable, at least 2, on a plain plate

### Fruit Section -

- Class 27 - Strawberries, 6, with stalks and calyces, on a plain plate
- Class 28 - Raspberries, 6, with stalks and calyces, on a plain plate
- Class 29 - Any other fruit, at least 2, on a plain plate.
